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Last week members of the School Council were invited to deliver the generous offerings made at the Harvest Festival to the West Berks Foodbank in Newbury. School Councillors from Years 4, 5 and 6 showed excellence in their organisational and logistical skills; packing up the goods from church, loading the minibus and then transferring the food into crates upon arrival at the Foodbank.

The children experienced first-hand how the food is logged, weighed and sorted according to type and date. They attentively listened to instruction and then rolled up their sleeves and assisted the various volunteers. We were then given a full tour of the warehouse. We learnt how the foodbank works with schools, churches and supermarkets (the latter mostly provide fresh produce) for donations. We observed boxes being packed up, noting the attention to details for individuals and families which ensures they receive items that are of use and to preference.

The children were amazed by the whole process and also found it interesting to see that it isn't just food that is sent out – household goods are always desperately needed together with baby products and even pet food. It was a thought-provoking day and gave us great joy to see how the donations given from our school will go toward supporting over a thousand families a month who are in urgent need of assistance. The School Council representatives displayed a mature and enquiring attitude and it was a privilege to attend with them.

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Our Y3 historians travelled back in time this week and spent an afternoon at West Berkshire Museum in Newbury learning about different aspects of Roman life. They tried on clothes that the Romans wore, looked at an artefact collection including pots, beakers and cutlery and they made a Bulla (a necklace with a charm inside that Roman boys tended to wear from birth until the age of 16).

The children also learned about food that the Romans brought to Britain and the uniform that a Roman soldier wore.







### **MEASLES**

Measles cases are rising across the country, with over 102,000 children starting primary school in England being at risk of catching the disease. Key messages from the NHS about measles / MMR and how to get vaccinated can be found via the links.

The <u>Back to school MMR Guidance</u> from the NHS includes information to share, as well as example social media posts which can be found here: <u>NHS Vaccine Poster</u> and <u>NHS MMR</u> <u>Poster</u>.

Measles is highly infectious and if left unvaccinated nine out of ten children in an early years setting can catch the disease if just one child is infectious. Please share these resources with colleagues, parents, and where suitable, community organisations to increase awareness and encourage parents to get their children vaccinated.

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### **BONFIRE NIGHT**

Bonfire Night, also known as Guy Fawkes Night, marks the failed Gunpowder Plot of 1605, where Guy Fawkes and his fellow conspirators attempted to blow up the English Parliament and King James I.

Their plot was foiled, and ever since, we've lit bonfires and fireworks to commemorate the event.

It's not just a night for ooohs and aaahs at the sky; it's also a wonderful learning opportunity for our children. Schools often provide historical context and safety tips around this time, but there's so much more you can do at home. Whether it's creating crafts, cooking up a storm with traditional Bonfire Night treats like toffee apples, or simply sharing the story behind Guy Fawkes, it's a perfect occasion for family bonding.

Safety, of course, is always our top priority. Please make sure to follow the Firework Code and supervise your children closely. This ensures that the evening remains a joyful experience for everyone involved. So as you wrap up warm and step out to enjoy the firework displays and bonfires, take a moment to reflect on the history behind the celebration. It's a wonderful way to make the night not just entertaining but also educational for the whole family.




### The Night Box LOUISE GREIG Illustrated by Ashling Lindsay

Whilst this book might not actually be about bonfire night or fireworks, it does celebrate the light that shines through the dark. Nominated for the CILIP Kate Greenaway Medal and shortlisted for the Waterstones Children's Book Prize, the Teach Primary Book Awards and the Klaus Flugge Prize. An enchanting bedtime story about a small boy who is the custodian of night, from talented new picture book author and poet, Louise Greig, with beautifully atmospheric illustrations by Ashling Lindsay.

Max has a key and a box of midnight blue. When he turns the key in the lock – WHOOSH! Day slips inside as Night sweeps out. Darkness tumbles into the air. It dances and whirls around the room. It goes under the bed, under the chair – everywhere!

Louise Greig's lyrical voice and Ashling Lindsay's warm, endearing illustrations hold a candle up to the magical nature of night time in this soothing picture book. Perfect for cosying up to read and share before bedtime, The Night Box is an original bedtime tale that sits perfectly alongside classics such as The Owl who was Afraid of the Dark – great for reassuring little ones who have a fear of the dark and calming down lively children before bedtime!"

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
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### Black Powder ALLY SHERRICK
