Doing this can double the chance of your child becoming a good reader. Yes, it's really that simple.

Please visit https://turnonthesubtitles.org/parents/ to see Hollywood legend Jack Black explain how you can turn screen time into reading time in 10 seconds.

If you're curious:

Here is the academic research behind this

Turning on quality subtitles means your child will read a staggering number of words. Put them on and your child will read the equivalent number of words that are in all the Harry Potter books, all of the Lord of the Rings, all of the Chronicles of Narnia and everything Roald Dahl wrote, combined!

Research has shown that it can double the chance of your child leaving school as a proficient reader. You can turn them on for the whole family or most streaming services will now allow you to do it just for children's profiles.

Perhaps, after all, there is a magic button....

Book Fair

The Book Fair has arrived in school, with hundreds of new children's books to browse and buy.

WHEN: 12th - 18th March 2024

WHERE: The children have been given the opportunity to go in school time to have a look at the books on offer, PLUS the Book Fair will be open to parents on **Friday 15th March 2024**

from 1:30pm, so come along after school to browse the Book Fair!

We will be completely cashless this year and will be using the Book Fair online payment portal, which you can access here:

www.travellingbooks.co.uk/pay or via the QR code below

The children will fill in a 'Wish List' order form at school, which they will bring home. Using their Wish List, you will be able to buy books through the website www.travellingbooks.co.uk/pay or via the QR code below.

Once you have paid you will receive a 7-digit reference number. Please write this number on the wish list, alongside the title of the book/s you wish to purchase.

This is a payment platform where you will be able to pay an amount, not purchase a specific book. We will know what book/s your child ordered as it will be on their wish list.
